



DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY REGULATIONS

(COVID-19 State of Emergency – November 10, 2020)

TOWN OF PEMBROKE PARK EXTENTIONS OF DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a contagious disease that has the ability to spread rapidly among humans and animals and may result in serious illness or death, constituting a clear and present danger to the lives, health, welfare, and safety of the residents of the Town of Pembroke Park; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order number 20-51 directing the Florida Department of Health to issue a Public Health Emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, the State Surgeon General and State Health Officer declared a Public Health Emergency exists in the State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order number 20-52 which declared a State of Emergency for the State of Florida due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, the Town of Pembroke Park declared a State of Local Emergency on March 9, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes require that the duration of each state of emergency declared locally is limited to 7 days but may be extended, as necessary, in 7-day increments.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Town of Pembroke Park, Florida:

Section 1. Extension of Declaration of Emergency Regulations. The Declaration of Emergency originally declared by the Town on March 9 is hereby extended as of November 10, 2020.

Section 2. Renewal of Emergency Regulations. This Declaration of Emergency Regulations shall renew every seven (7) days hereafter. This declaration will expire in conjunction with State of Florida Emergency Order 20-52.
